How quickly time flies. I can't believe we are now in the last few weeks of this academic year.

Over the past few years there have been changes to education at a national level, linked to the Scottish Government's National Improvement Framework and Pupil Equity Funding. This will continue to have an impact on the work and developments within Crosshouse. This year we received £94.800 through Pupil Equity Funding which has been used on a number of interventions, all aimed at closing the attainment gap within our school. We have received £102,000 for session 2019/2020. Further information on how we plan to use this funding will be provided in the new term.

As you know we have employed an additional Physical Education teacher which has allowed class teachers to provide targeted support to groups of children, and this will continue next year.

This year we have worked hard to improve our Writing curriculum, as well as improving our approaches to anti-bullying and personalised support for learners. We have continued to develop our approaches to outdoor learning and family learning. We look forward to

continuing our family learning and engagement further next session. We will also be evaluating our curriculum rationale, improving our Health & Wellbeing, Science and Social Subjects curriculum.
